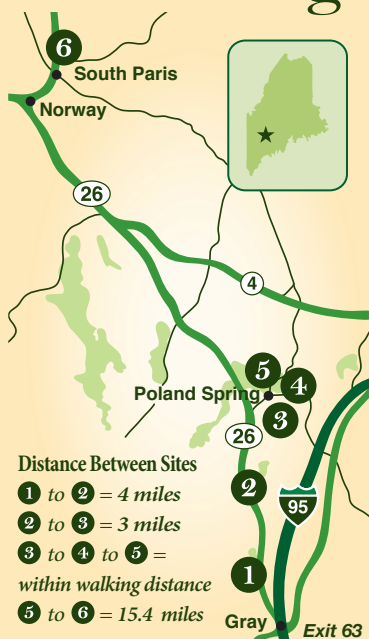


Finding *The Gems* of **26**

4 POLAND SPRING PRESERVATION SOCIETY, Poland Spring
Museum, art gallery, chapel and gift shop are housed in two buildings listed on the National Registry of Historic Places, the Maine State Building (originally located in Chicago at the 1893 Worlds Fair) and All Souls Chapel. Museum tours focus on the history of Poland Spring, highlighting the Victorian and Gilded ages. Located on the grounds of Poland Spring Resort.

5 POLAND SPRING PRESERVATION PARK, Poland Spring
In the early 1900s a state of the art Spanish style water bottling facility and springhouse were constructed at Poland Spring. Today this property is known as Preservation Park, home to over five miles of recreational trails and the Poland Spring Museum and Environmental Education Center. Tour the former bottling facility and discover the rich history behind Poland Spring Water.

6 McLAUGHLIN GARDEN, South Paris
Features mature collections of hostas, daylilies, astilbes, iris, phlox, sedum, cimicifuga, sempervivums, Maine wildflowers and ferns and over 200 lilacs all beneath a canopy of mature deciduous and coniferous trees. Explore the historic home, barn, Garden Gift Shop and Garden Café as you enjoy the serenity of this Maine treasure.
